SURGICAL PATHOLOGY FOR THE PRACTICING PATHOLOGIST SANIBEL HARBOUR RESORT AND SPA, FT. MYERS, FLORIDA, MARCH 12-15, 2010

This four-day postgraduate course is under the direction of Robert H. Young, MD with additional Harvard Medical School Faculty (Dr. M. Lerwill -Breast Pathology and Dr. A. Rosenberg-Soft Tissue and Bone Pathology and other Harvard faculty to be determined). Guest faculty will include Dr. Klaus Busam-Dermatopathology and Dr. Bruce Wenig-Head and Neck Pathology. The resort, which has a renowned spa, is located on a private peninsula with a panoramic water view looking towards the islands of Sanibel and Captiva, well known for their unspoiled charm. Many opportunities exist for vacation activities before or after the course, enjoying the delightful weather typical of Florida in mid to late March. CME credit will be approximately 23 hours. The registration fee will be \$895.00 with a reduction for trainees.

GYNECOLOGIC AND OBSTETRIC PATHOLOGY FOR THE PRACTICING PATHOLOGIST LOEWS VENTANA CANYON RESORT, TUCSON, ARIZONA, APRIL 8-11, 2010

This four-day postgraduate course is under the direction of Robert H. Young, MD and David C. Wilbur, MD, with additional faculty of Dr. Debra Bell (Mayo Clinic), Esther Oliva, MD, and Drucilla Roberts, MD, the latter two speakers of the Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School. The course will be a comprehensive coverage of female reproductive tract pathology, including comprehensive coverage of frequent problems in differential diagnosis and an update on newly described entities and new issues in terminology. The course is being held at an elegant resort in the northern part of Tucson, in the foothills of the Catalina Mountains, with spectacular scenery and many leisure activities available. The course fee will be along the lines of the above. The course credit will be approximately 23 hours.

UROLOGIC SURGICAL PATHOLOGY FOR THE PRACTICING PATHOLOGIST NAPLES GRANDE RESORT AND SPA, NAPLES, FLORIDA, APRIL 26-29, 2010

This four-day postgraduate course is under the direction of Robert H. Young, MD and has as additional faculty Drs. Mahul Amin, John Eble, and Peter Humphrey. The course is being held at a renowned resort hotel a few minutes from the center of the sophisticated town of Naples with numerous outstanding restaurants and elegant shops. The hotel is connected by an attractive boardwalk to the expansive beach of Naples. The course fee will be along the above lines. The course credit will be approximately 23 hours.

GASTROINTESTINAL, LIVER, AND PANCREATIC PATHOLOGY FAIRMONT COPLEY PLAZA HOTEL, BOSTON, MA, MAY 3-6, 2010

The Brigham and Women's and the Massachusetts General Hospitals are co-sponsoring this course under the direction of Robert D. Odze, M.D. and Gregory Y. Lauwers, M.D. This course provides a comprehensive review of the current concepts in diagnostic surgical pathology of the gastro-intestinal tract, liver, gallbladder, and pancreas. The role of pathologists in the diagnosis and reporting of endoscopically obtained biopsies and resection specimens is emphasized. A CD-ROM, including lectures and photographs of the entities presented during the course, is available on request. This educational activity enables attendees 28.25 hours of CME. The 2007 registration fee was \$975.00 for the course only, and \$1100 with CD-ROM.

**HARVARD DERMATOPATHOLOGY UPDATE
FAIRMONT COPLEY PLAZA HOTEL, BOSTON, MA, SEPTEMBER 23-25, 2010**

This intensive course under the direction of Drs. Lyn Duncan, Martin Mihm, Jr., Mai Hoang, George Murphy, and Steven Tahan is aimed at practicing pathologists, dermatopathologists, and dermatologists. Its goal is to provide an in-depth review and update on selected topics in dermatopathology. A library of interesting cases will be available for the students to review independently at the microscopes throughout the course. The participants will have an opportunity to attend a clinicopathological exercise that will be published as a "CPC Conference in the Case Records of the Massachusetts General Hospital Section of the New England Journal of Medicine". Each participant will receive a comprehensive course syllabus, and a book discussing cases presented at the Slide Seminar. **CURRENT CONCEPTS IN SURGICAL PATHOLOGY, 31st ANNUAL COURSE
FOUR SEASONS HOTEL, BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS, NOVEMBER 8-12, 2010**

This five day postgraduate course is under the direction of Drs. Eugene J. Mark, Judith A. Ferry, Andrew E. Rosenberg, and Robert H. Young, with approximately 35 faculty members from the Massachusetts General Hospital. The course will emphasize light microscopic differential diagnoses of commonly encountered problems in surgical pathology but will also include application of molecular pathology and cytopathology. The course will include small group slide review sessions and informal small group evening seminars. The glass slide use at the small group slide review sessions will be available throughout the week for examination on one's own time. The hotel is located centrally opposite the Boston Public Garden and close to fine shopping. Participants will receive a syllabus and a CD ROM of the course proceedings. The registration fee is approximately \$1,000.00.

**SURGICAL PATHOLOGY FOR THE PRACTICING PATHOLOGIST
CAMELBACK INN, SCOTTSDALE, ARIZONA, JANUARY 15-18, 2011**

This four-day postgraduate course in Surgical Pathology is under the direction of Robert H. Young, MD. Speakers will include several from the Massachusetts General Hospital and at least two guest speakers and topics selected will, to the extent possible, be different from those in recent offerings of this course. The course is being held at a well-known resort hotel with outstanding spa beautifully situated in scenic Scottsdale in close proximity to art galleries, fine shopping, and many outstanding restaurants. Trips to Tucson and the famous Red Rock Country of Sedona are easily done using the resort as a base and the mild winter climate in Arizona has strong appeal to most. CME credit will be approximately 24 hours. The registration fee will be along the lines of the above.
